Welcome to the July newsletter

Unfortunately, our team of one came down with “Wellington Variant” of Covid at our recent Peak Bodies meeting so please be patient if Wayne has not come back to you yet. He is working his way through the emails and messages 😊

July has been another busy month with consultation on the Strategic Component section of the UFS. Applications are now being taken and there are workshops coming up to support PTEs applying for the fund. The ITENZ Board have continued to raise flags with the Minister, TEC and the Ministry of Education where we see issues affecting our sector. Are we being listened to? The jury is out and Wayne and I are following up on comments made by the Minister to see whether they have actually been followed through with. In saying that, we had a positive meeting with Paul Delahunty, the RoVE Director, on the effects of the RoVE and UFS on the PTE sector.

The borders opened on the 1st of August. The media’s story was how international students would start coming in to NZ. What they didn’t pick up is that this is only the start of visa processing for student visas and that student arrivals, other than those coming in through Border Exemption Cohorts, could still be months away! We have been talking to INZ regarding visa processing to ensure that there are timeframes to meet for case officers.

Our compliance meeting is still in planning stage while MOE make arrangements with the other agencies. This meeting provides the opportunity to help agencies understand how much duplication we have in the system and the costs that PTEs have to meet in complying with regulations.

Next on the block is the introduction of Skills Standards and yet even more change for the sector.

See you all at the Conference in October! There is a great selection of speakers again this year.



Academic Managers Community of Practice

The Academic Managers CoP met on 27th July. Discussions focused on student achievement, including the various forms it takes, the completion rates, student voice, and literacy and numeracy. The group also discussed stakeholder engagement and whether attention was appropriately distributed. Building relationships with WDCs and RSLGs was identified as an important activity.

The next meeting is on **28th September** and will focus on micro-credentials, skill standards, and UFS.

Māori Engagement Community of Practice

The Maori Engagement community of practice continues to explore the ways ITENZ members can better support our tauira, rangatira and akonga. We are interested to hear ideas from any PTEs who might have experience that others could use, very much focused on what works to better support and engage our current cohorts. Several members shared recent learnings and professional development, including Ako Aotearoa's excellent Te Tiriti training, and their Pathways Awarua resources for management.

There was also mention of Critical te Tiriti Analysis aka CTA which has a strong presence in health policy development, and could easily be applied to policies in education.

We are also hoping to see you at the October ITENZ conference, where we will host something of a collaborative enquiry.


Regional Skills Leadership Groups (RSLG) workforce development plans

The RSLGs have released their [regional workforce development plans](#).

"Each plan is unique to its region and reflects the sectors, opportunities, challenges, demographics and previous labour market planning within that region. RSLGs have built on existing work so activity isn't duplicated.

The plans identify priority sectors and note that other sectors will be considered in future versions – Regional Workforce Plans will be refreshed annually. They reflect engagement with stakeholders (somewhat curtailed in 2021/22 due to COVID), which is an important and ongoing part of RSLG mahi.

Regional Workforce Plans largely focus on regional solutions to regional problems but also suggest actions at a central government level where regional solutions may not be possible or the challenge or opportunity is a national one."
