Welcome to the May newsletter.

Since our last newsletter we have continued the lobbying for the UFS and Immigration Reset. We understand the uncertainty that you are all facing. Board members are in the same situation so we have first hand experience to lobby for change. We have secured another meeting in June with Minister Hipkins and have met with our Peak Body counterparts, QTI and the International Peak Bodies Alliance incorporating the Schools, Universities, Te Pukenga, English NZ and PTEs to continue our work.

We realise how frustrating it is at the moment and we are working on your behalf. On the 5th May, Wayne and I met with MBIE and INZ, a first post-Covid meeting and this was followed by a meeting with a face to face meeting with the Minister. The board is also lobbying other political parties and are looking at joint options available with other affected organisations.

Work is still happening on the Youth Guarantee funding review and Wayne is representing ITENZ on a number of workshops with government agencies.

Don't forget the ITENZ conference in October we hope to meet you all there.

Communities of Practice

Academic Managers

The Academic Managers group met on 25th May and covered issues related to compliance, funding and mental health. The Strategic Component of the UFS was discussed, and the role various entities will play in determining its use. How providers deal with mental health issues of their learners, and the extent to which they are capable of doing so, was an issue of interest to group members. The next meeting is on 27th July TBC)

Youth Guarantee Providers

The Youth Guarantee Providers group met on 26 May and discussed feedback from recent EERs, WDC external moderation expectations, and learner retention during

Covid. The next meeting is scheduled for 7 July via Microsoft Teams

Māori Engagement

The Māori Engagement group meets monthly, 2.00-3.00 pm on the second Tuesday of each month by zoom. The focus is on supporting each other with everything from baby steps to big picture, from how to better support our Māori learners, and how to develop relationships with local whanau, hapu, iwi – whoever is appropriate for what we're trying to do. Often one participant will share their situation and aspirations, and we have a very draft development framework – focus on outcomes, not just korero.

Our current motto is “be the koha not the hoha”, with emphasis being on what we can offer local stakeholders and not on ticking NZQA boxes – we’re going to focus on what we can offer people, not what NZQA or any other organisation needs us to do.

WDC programme endorsement

From 1 June 2022, Workforce Development Councils (WDCs) will consider new and changed provider programmes for endorsement, prior to NZQA approval. WDC considerations for programme endorsement differ from NZQA approval criteria and look to meet both industry and learner vocational education and training needs. The Workforce Development Councils are committed to providing guidance for providers to develop and gain approval for high-quality programmes and are encouraging education providers to familiarise themselves with the endorsement considerations early in their development process
