Strategic Funding Update

TEC have reported that they have received 121 proposals from 90 PTEs covering a broad range of innovative and strategic proposals.

They have had a team of 15 assessors who have been working through the proposals over the last few weeks. In addition, peer reviews have been undertaken by three senior staff within UFS.

Next Steps:

- All proposals to be assessed by 5 October
- All PTE Proposals to go to Panel for review and recommendation between 6 and 18 October
- Recommendations to go to DCE Delivery for decision
- Outcome letters will be sent to ALL PTEs advising of the decision to either Fund in Full, Fund in Part or Decline – these letters will note where TEC is looking to engage with the PTE further on milestones and/or the proposal's proposed budget

- A Right of Response process to commence for those who received a decision of Fund in Part or Decline with providers having 10 days to respond

ITENZ and Muka Tangata (People, Food and Fibre WDC) sign relationship agreement.

ITENZ and Muka Tangata have signed a relationship agreement which acknowledges the important role we both play in the participation and success of the tertiary sector and which commits us to working together to identify opportunities to share resources and information, work collaboratively to support and ensure high quality training and assessment of programmes that meet industry and stakeholder needs, and work together on specific projects.

A key aim is to establish channels for regular and open engagement and communication between ITENZ and PTEs represented by ITENZ, and Muka Tangata and to provide opportunities for ITENZ members involved in the food and fibre sector to contribute to the development of qualifications, standards and micro-credentials developed by Muka Tangata, and enable support by Muka Tangata in the development of programmes by these PTEs to meet industry needs.

To that end, we are setting up monthly meetings between Muka Tangata and interested ITENZ members to discuss issues pertinent to quality assurance and qualifications & standards at Muka Tangata.

The first of these is on **5th October at 1pm**. If you are interested in attending and haven't already let me know, please do so.

Māori Engagement Ropu
